

**LAKESIDE COUNTRY CLUB
STANDING RULES**

(Revised January 2019)

The following Standing Rules have been adopted by the Board of Directors for the purpose of efficient operation and assurance to each member of the fullest enjoyment of the Club facilities consistent with interest of the membership as a whole. The Board of Directors may, from time to time, promulgate other and additional Special Rules. All prior Rules are hereby revoked.

GENERAL

These General Rules apply to all Club activities and facilities.

1. USE OF FACILITIES

The Club facilities are available only to members, their household families and guests. A member's household family, within the meaning of these Rules, shall include the member's spouse, minor children (18 or younger), and unmarried children over 18 who are part of the member's immediate household, but in no event past the age of 25. Unmarried children (including stepchildren) over 18 and not past the age of 25 shall be considered part of the member's immediate household unless such child lives independently outside the member's residence and is not a full time student in a college or university. Household employees, including nannies, au pairs and babysitters, and former spouses, are not considered part of a member's household family or immediate household. The member shall be considered to be the primary golfer unless the Board is notified in writing that the member's spouse has been designated as the primary golfer".

2. GUESTS

Guests are not permitted to use any of the Club facilities except when accompanied by a member or (a) they are holders of a Guest Card as provided in Rule 3, (b) they are participating as invitees in a Club sponsored activity for which special advance arrangements have been made, or (c) they are guests at a party or activity sponsored by a member and for which special advance arrangements have been made. Members are at all times responsible for the behavior of their guests, whether the member is present at the time or not, and this shall include liability for any damage to the Club property caused by such guest.

3. GUEST CARDS

Guest cards will be issued by the General Manager only to non-residents of Harris or adjoining counties of Texas, for a period not to exceed ten (10) days and upon the request of a member and the holder of such a card shall for such period of time be extended all of the privileges of the Club, subject to the payment of all applicable Guest Fees. A Guest Card is not transferable and is not renewable except under unusual circumstances. It is for the personal use of the holder and the guest's immediate family only. No member may have more than two (2) such cards outstanding at one time. All charges incurred by guest are chargeable to the host member. Holders of Guest Cards will not bring golfing guests, nor will they tee off on Saturdays, Sundays, or Holidays (including Quasi-Holidays) unless accompanied by a Club Member.

4. HOLIDAYS

4.1 Holidays, as used in these Rules, shall mean Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day and Thanksgiving Day. Member's activities at the Club falling on Saturday holidays shall be governed by Saturday Rules; and for holidays falling on Sundays, the following Monday shall be observed as the holiday with established holiday Rules governing membership activities on such Mondays

4.2 Quasi-Holidays as used in these Rules mean New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents' Day, and Fridays following July 4 and Christmas Day when those holidays fall on a Thursday. Other Quasi-Holidays may be designated by the Board and notice given.

5. CLUB CLOSINGS

The entire Club is closed on Christmas Day. The Club is closed at 5:00 p.m. on Easter Sunday and Thanksgiving evening, and at 3:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve. The Club is also closed on all Mondays except when a Holiday falls on Monday or a Quasi-Holiday is being observed as a holiday. When the Club is open Monday in observance of a holiday, it will be closed on the following Tuesday. When the Club is open on a limited basis on a Monday in observance of a Quasi-Holiday, it will be open as usual on the following Tuesday. Each year, the Club's Banquet Department and A' la Carte Dining Room will close for one week for annual cleaning and repairs. Specific dates will be posted in the Club's bulletin.

6. SALE OF GOODS

No article of any kind shall be exposed for sale on Club property, no subscription papers shall be circulated nor advertisements displayed except as to articles available to members in the Golf, Tennis, and Swimming Shops or as otherwise authorized by Club management.

7. CONDUCT

Good order and decorum must be observed in all parts of the Clubhouse and premises. Any member, member of household family, guest or visitor conducting him or herself in an unbecoming manner shall be reported to the Board of Directors for such action as they may deem appropriate.

8. ENFORCEMENT

It is anticipated that these Rules will be self-enforcing by a membership wholly aware of their necessity. Otherwise, enforcement will be addressed by the appropriate committee of the Board of Directors through warning, fine, or other disciplinary action including expulsion. The General Manager, Golf Professionals, Golf Course Superintendent, Tennis & Fitness and Swimming Professionals and other supervisory employees are charged with enforcing these Rules and the membership will respect their positions in this regard.

9. DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS

Current accounts are payable by the last day of the month in which the statement is received. Failure to pay by this date automatically makes the member's account delinquent and the following late charges will be assessed: first month of delinquency, \$25.00; two consecutive months of delinquency, \$100.00; increasing by \$50.00 per month with each successive month of delinquency, with a maximum of \$250.00. "Due Notice" of

delinquency will be given the member by a pink slip attached to the member's statement. Posting of delinquent accounts shall be made in accordance with Section 6.4 of the By-Laws.

10. RECIPROCITY

We have no agreement with any other club, local or otherwise, for interchange of membership privileges, except however, this club will honor charges made to its members in good standing at other clubs upon signed charge slips furnished to our office, but the arrangements with the other Club are entirely up to the member and the management of such other club.

HOUSE RULES

11. FOOD AND BEVERAGE SERVICES

Members, their families and guests will be offered food and beverage service in accordance with menus available in each respective area of service. Such menus will be prepared with maximum consideration for variety and taste consistent with service facilities available at each point of service. Members are requested to order from the menus. Food or Beverages may not be brought onto the Club property for consumption except where prior permission has been obtained from management for items such as Birthday cakes etc...

12. DRINK SERVICES

Alcoholic beverages are available upon order, to adults only, in all regular service areas. Such service at other facilities on Club property will be only by special arrangement with the Banquet Office. The bars will not be open after 12:00 midnight on weekdays or between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Sundays. All beverages served on Club property must be obtained through the Club. **Alcoholic beverages will not at any time be served to or consumed by minors under the age of 21 on Club property.**

13. GRATUITY

A monthly service fee has been implemented for all member areas. A gratuity may, however, be added to checks.

\$65.00 payable monthly by Active, Junior, Interim and Senior members.

\$32.50 payable monthly by Associate, Super Senior and Non-Resident members.

All private banquet functions, food and beverage charges associated with golf and tennis tournaments, and Club sponsored functions will have a 20% service charge.

14. RESERVATIONS

14.1 Tables in the Dining Room and reservations for special events may be reserved by calling the receptionist, dining room. Such reservations must include the hour of intended dining. Reservations will be held for arrival no longer than fifteen (15) minutes after the appointed time when, in the judgment of the Dining Room Manager, other members and their guests are being unduly inconvenienced by the late arrival of members holding reservations.

14.2 The private rooms of the Clubhouse are available to members for special meetings, luncheons, dinners and parties at additional charge by reservation with the Catering Office. Such reservations, if canceled, must be canceled forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the proposed use or appropriate charges will be made.

14.3 The Ballroom, Pinelake Room, Gallery, Colonial Room, Crystal Lounge, and Board Room may be reserved for exclusive use at prevailing charges by any member upon application to the Catering Office. All parties desiring the use of such rooms must be sponsored by a member of the Club. Reservations may not be made prior to twelve (12) months in advance of the proposed date and cancellations, if any, must be made at least ninety (90) days in advance. Failure to cancel prior to that time may result in a monetary r penalty.

14.4 For special events, to include golf tournaments, tennis tournaments, holiday dining, and dinner dances; a minimum forty-eight (48) hour cancellation is required. In the absence of such advance cancellation of reservations, charges will be levied as established for the event.

15. SMOKING

With the exception of a designated smoking area just outside the Men’s Grill, no smoking, to include cigars and no vaping, will be permissible in (i) any area of the Clubhouse, to include all hallways, banquet rooms, and entrances, (ii) any and all outside dining areas, including the Bar Patio, Banquet Patio, Oasis Patio, Tennis and Fitness Center Patio and pool areas where food is served, and Members may request in writing to the Board of Directors a variance (as per City ordinance) to the smoking policy for a private event, and must receive approval prior to their function.

16. MEMBER DINING

The Club has a number of dining options. The Men’s and Ladies’ Grills are available each day for lunch. Lunch and Dinner are provided in a casual atmosphere in our Main Dining Room.

17. LOCKER ROOM

17.1 The locker room, lounge and bar areas are primarily for the use of adults. Children are not allowed with the following exceptions in the locker room areas: when they are actually engaged in showering or changing clothes, or for access to the rest rooms, or while accompanied by an adult. The attendants in the locker room are instructed to enforce these Rules.

17.2 Locker Rentals/Fees: Members with golfing privileges will have priority. Locker fees will be posted from time to time. Until further notice, monthly locker fees will be as follows:

17.3 Grills: Individuals, are invited to use the grills adjacent to their respective Locker Room for meals, drink service and card playing, so long as space there is available, thus leaving the Dining Room for mixed groups, insofar as possible. Each grill is an adjunct of, but not a part of, a Locker Room and individuals in the grills will be fully clothed. Children under the age of 18 are not permitted in either the Men's Grill or the Ladies' Grill at any time. Individuals aged 18-20 may use these facilities only when accompanied by an individual who is 21 years of age or older.

17.4 Lounge: The Men's Locker Room Lounge adjacent to the Men's Grill is for the use of adults 21 years of age or older. Individuals aged 18-20 may use this facility only when accompanied by an individual who is 21 years of age or older.

18. CHILDREN

The age requirement for children dining unaccompanied in the Main Dining Room and outside Bar Patio is 13. Individuals under the age of 13 may use the Bar Patio if accompanied by individuals 21 years of age or older. Children under the age of 18 are not permitted in the Member Bar. The Member Bar is for use by those aged 21 years of age or older. Individuals aged 18-20 may use this area if accompanied by individuals 21 years of age or older.

Members and guests are required to dress their children in appropriate attire consistent with their parents.

On occasion when the Oasis Café is reserved for a private function or in the discretion of Club management, the club will open the Ladies Locker Room Lounge to allow those wishing to dine in casual attire consistent with the dress code for the Oasis Café.

19. WAVE CAVE

The Wave Cave is available to minors of all ages, although certain areas or equipment may be restricted to certain ages from time to time. The attendant, through instructions from the management, will have authority to enforce all Rules of the Wave Cave.

Parents will be held responsible for the behavior of their children and their children's guests at all times. The same Rules apply to grandparents and their grandchildren.

20. SERVICE HOURS

Service hours pertaining to each area of the Club are posted and published periodically as necessary.

21. SERVICE CHECKS

Members are required to sign service checks for all services rendered.

22. CELLULAR PHONE USAGE

Talking on cellular phones is not permissible in the Member Dining Areas. This includes the Men's and Women's Grills, the Main Dining Room and Bar, the Crystal lounge, the outside Bar Patio, and the Living Room in the Clubhouse.

23. DRESS CODE

23.1 Main Dining Room

The Main Dining Room is available for those wishing to dine in casual attire; however, the following may not be worn: exercise outfits, gym shorts or pants, tee shirts, cut-offs men's flip-flops, or men's caps. Members and guests twelve (12) years and older may not wear shorts after 6:00 p.m., except when

specifically excused for a function by a club committee. Members and guests may wear designer or appropriate jeans.

23.2 The Bar & Patio

The Bar and Patio dress code will be similar to the Main Dining Room (see 23.1), however, a more relaxed dress code is acceptable, and the following will be permitted at any time: exercise outfits, gym shorts or pants, appropriate jeans, and caps on the Patio only.

23.3 Clubhouse

All individuals in the Clubhouse are required to wear shoes.

23.4 Consequences:

First Offense - Receipt of a courtesy card, followed by a letter.

Second Offense - A \$100 fine with a letter from the Board of Directors.

Third Offense - A \$250 fine and appearance before the Board of Directors.

Any infraction should expire and be cleared one year after the first offense.

24. **PARKING**

For the safety and consideration of other members, please park only in designated areas. Handicap parking is available. A notice of violation, placed on the windshield, will be issued to vehicles parked in areas marked as non-parking areas. A repeat parking offense in a non-designated area may result in a fine.

25. **GAMES**

Card games may be played in the Men's Grill and such other rooms as may be set aside for such purposes; however, the Board of Directors and / or Club Management will exercise their authority to suppress any game of gambling or other game which may be considered to disturb others or be improper or prejudicial to the Club.

26. **EMPLOYEES**

No member shall reprimand or in any way punish any employee of the Club, but shall report all instances of misconduct or other complaints to the management. Employees are not permitted to leave their stations and members are requested not to send employees on errands without consulting the appropriate supervisor. No member is to direct the work of any employee.

27. **CLUB PROPERTY**

Damage to Club property by members or their guests will be charged to the account of the member responsible at the discretion of the Board.

28. **PRIVATE PROPERTY**

All private property, including automobiles, and other personal property or belongings, whether of members or guests, while in or on the Club premises shall be solely at the owner's risk. The Club assumes no responsibility for damage to or loss of such property. Any handling of such private property by Club employees, caddies or other non-employees shall not constitute acceptance of responsibility therefore by the Club.

29. PETS

Dogs or other pets, with the exception of guide dogs, are not allowed in any part of the Clubhouse or grounds.

GOLF RULES

30. GUESTS, FEES AND PRIMARY GOLFER DESIGNATION

30.1 Non-residents of Harris County or an adjoining county may play at any time as a guest if the guest (1) is accompanied by a member, or (2) holds a valid Guest Card issued by the Club as provided in the General Rules, except on a Saturday, Sunday, Holiday or Quasi-Holiday, when the guest must be accompanied by a member. A non-resident guest must be accompanied by a member on a Saturday, Sunday, Holiday and Quasi-Holiday.

30.2 A resident of Harris County or an adjoining county may play as a guest no more than twice each month, and then only when accompanied by a member. Residents of Harris County or an adjoining county may play after 1:00 p.m. on Saturdays and holidays, and before 1:00 p.m. on Sundays. A charge of \$100.00 will be levied against a member for breach of this rule, or for misrepresentation of the residence of the guest.

30.3 Lakeside Family Guests are defined as: parents, non-household children and their spouses; brothers, sisters and their spouses; and grandchildren over the age of 15. If residents of Harris County or an adjoining county, they may play as a guest at the family guest rate no more than twice each month accompanied by the specific family member, at times designated for resident guest play.

30.4 Guest fees will be posted from time to time. Until further notice, guest fees will be as follows *

Weekdays (Tues.-Thurs.)	\$ 90 plus tax
Weekends (Fri., Sat., Sun.)	\$120 plus tax
Holidays and Quasi-Holidays	\$120 plus tax
Family Guests	\$ 35 plus tax
Junior Guests (Under 16)	\$ 25 plus tax
Guest Card Holders	\$125 plus tax

* The fee for a fourth guest is doubled, for Weekends, Holidays and Quasi-Holidays.

30.5 The provisions of this Section 30 shall not apply to Section 30.5.1 or 30.5.2 below

30.5.1 Guests participating in golf functions for which waiver is specifically authorized

30.5.2 Officers or Golf Professionals of other country clubs, or persons playing at the invitation of Golf Professional or Officers of the Club in connection with the business or public relations of the Club may have their fees waived.

30.6 Each member shall be considered the Primary Golfer for that membership unless a written request is submitted to, and approved by, the Board of Directors for designating the member as not being the Primary Golfer, in which case the member's spouse, if any, shall be considered the Primary Golfer. Written requests to the Board of Directors to change the Primary Golfer status may only be submitted once per calendar year. In cases of death or divorce, the surviving or remaining member, as the case may be, shall automatically be

considered the Primary Golfer unless the surviving or remaining member notifies the Board of Directors in writing of the preference not to be a primary Golfer. Requests for change in Primary Golfer status will normally be acted upon by the Board of Directors within sixty (60) days of submission.

31 TEE TIMES

31.1 Tee times for member golfers, their family and guests shall be assigned in accordance with the Tee Time Schedule on the last page of the Standing Rules, with the following exceptions:

a. During the months of November through March, spouses of Primary Golfers and household children aged 15 to 25 years may tee off on or after 1:00 p.m. on Wednesdays and Thursdays;

b. Spouses of Primary Golfers and household children aged 15 to 25 years are provided with a second choice for tee times on Wednesdays and Thursday from 12:00 to 2:00 p.m., and Sundays before 10:00 a.m., whereby, after the lottery selection by Primary Golfers, the tee times left will be made available;

c. On Saturdays, at the discretion of the Golf Professional, spouses of Primary Golfers, household children aged 15 to 25 and specified juniors (in the Golf Professionals discretion) may tee off as early as 12:00 p.m., provided no starting times have been arranged by Primary Golfers between 12:00 and 1:00 p.m. or in the event such starting time remains available 24 hours prior to such starting time. Spouses of Primary Golfers shall have priority over household children aged 15 to 25 and specified juniors for such tee times;

d. On Tuesdays, at the discretion of the Golf Professional, Primary Golfers may tee off as early as 11:30 a.m. if no starting times have been arranged by Spouses of Primary Golfers between 11:30 a.m. and 12:00 noon, or in the event such starting time remains available 24 hours prior to such starting time;

e. On Tuesdays, at the discretion of the Golf Professional, household children 15-25 years old may tee off as early as 12:00 noon and accompanied children 10-14 may tee off as early as 11:30 am, if no starting times have been arranged by Spouses of Primary Golfers between 12:00 noon and 12:30 pm or if such starting time remains available 24 hours prior to such starting time.

f. On Wednesdays following Tuesdays when the Club is closed, except when the Wednesday falls on a Holiday or Quasi-Holiday, tee times shall be available with priority to non-primary golfers and their guests, then made available to primary golfers and their guests, and other categories based on tee times still remaining.

31.2 Reservations for tee times may be made with the Golf Shop or Foretees using an electronic system which shall be administered two days in advance. Member golfers and their family and guests, can be assigned any tee time that is still available 24 hours before the tee time, except on Tuesday's before Noon and on Saturday's before Noon.

32. CHILDREN

32.1 Children under 10 may not play unaccompanied at any time.

32.2 Matches including children under the age of fifteen (15) should not be played when the course is crowded and, in any event, must permit adult matches to play through.

32.3 Parents will acquaint their children with the Rules and golf etiquette. Children will not loiter on the golf course at any time. Children walking to and from the tennis courts are not to cross the golf fairways at any time.

32.4 For tee times specific to children see Tee Time Schedule on the last page of the Standing Rules.

33. GOLF CARTS

33.1 Push Trolleys may be used on the golf course. They must be kept off putting surfaces. Wet weather decisions will be made on a daily basis by the Superintendent. Privately owned trolleys are not permitted.

33.2 Electric carts - The Club will make available for use by all members electric carts. Privately owned carts are not permitted.

Strict adherence to the following Rules for the use of electric carts will be observed:

33.2.1 Normal Weather Restrictions – On par 3 holes, electric carts are to be kept on cart paths at all times. Around the tees and greens, all wheels of the cart should be on the cart path. When carts are allowed off the paths, drivers should observe caution to avoid worn, marked or wet areas. When traveling to the ball, carts should be driven on the cart paths as often as practicable.

33.2.2 Other Course Restrictions On all holes - electric carts may be restricted to cart paths as needed to preserve the condition of the course or to facilitate better course conditions, including bad weather and hot or dry weather. The initiation, continuation or removal of such restriction will be decided by the Golf Course Superintendent and/or Golf Professional.

33.2.3 Exemptions – A member or their household family may apply in writing to the Golf Professional for a waiver of the cart restriction policies. The application must include a written opinion from a licensed physician (who is not a member) stating that the applicant’s medical condition requires the applicant to have cart access from the paved cart paths to and from the golf course. Upon receipt and approval of the application by the Golf Professional, a colorful flag will be attached to the cart to designate the exemption. No exemption will be given when any course restrictions are in place. Those with an exemption will be allowed to drive their cart up to the point around the greens and tee boxes where the grass is cut to “rough height.” If an exempt cart chooses to drive on the fairway height grass then they should not be closer than 20 yards of the putting surface. Additionally, those carts with exemptions will be allowed to drive their cart on hole #14 to a point no farther than the 2nd bunker on the right. This is the only par three hole that will allow carts to travel off the cart paths. Exempt carts should still use the cart paths as much as possible.

33.2.4 Cart and Trolley Fees will be posted from time to time. Until further notice, these fees will be as follows:

Carts:	18 holes, per person	\$17.50 plus tax
	9 holes, per person	\$13.50 plus tax
	18 holes, bag attachment	\$13.50 plus tax
	9 holes, bag attachment	\$11.50 plus tax
Trolleys:	18 holes, per person	\$11.00 plus tax
	9 holes, per person	\$9.00 plus tax

33.2.5 No more than one (1) cart per twosome, two (2) carts per threesome or foursome and three (3) per fivesome will be allowed on the golf course. The Club does not advise more than two riders per electric cart, and does not believe anyone should ride standing on the back of the cart. Anyone who rides on the back of the cart (or anywhere outside of the cart) does so at his or her own risk and the Club will not be responsible for any injuries or damages.

33.2.6 Users of electric carts may use one caddie per foursome, or any user of such electric carts may use a caddie, if the players so desire, in which event the caddie shall be paid a minimum caddie fee as specified herein.

33.2.7 The Golf Committee will write each member that violates the proper use of a golf cart (as listed below), that a fine will be levied on the next reported occurrence. Members will be responsible for the actions of their guests.

Fines, in amounts below indicated, will be levied on golfers and any user of a cart for violations of the Rules as follows:

- a. Driving cart onto any green \$500.00
- b. Driving cart onto any tee or
into any sand bunker \$500.00
- c. Any willful damage to the golf course
or other facilities \$500.00
- d. Failure to observe restricted areas
or the 50-yard clearance rule \$100.00
- e. All other Rules \$100.00

The above fines may be increased for repeated violations of the Rules. Members are requested to report violations to the Chairman of the Green and Grounds Committee and/or Golf Committee, or to the Professional, preferably in writing. Repeated violations of these Rules shall also subject any member to a revocation of the privilege of using electric carts.

33.2.9 No person under the age of 18 years shall be permitted to operate an electric golf cart. However, a person 16 or 17 years of age, with a valid driver’s license, may be allowed to operate an electric golf cart if the Golf Professional has on file the appropriate agreement form signed by the individual and a parent. The person also must follow the guidelines as set forth by the Golf Committee and implemented through the Golf Pro Shop.

33.2.10 Anyone to whom an electric cart is assigned shall assume all risk for personal injury or property damage that may result from use of that cart.

33.2.11 No other type of vehicle is permitted on the golf course.

34. RULES TO PLAY

34.1 Pace of play is a very integral part of the atmosphere and golf experience. It has been determined that the time necessary to play a round of golf (18 holes) is not, under normal conditions, to exceed four (4) hours. During circumstances when carts are restricted to the cart paths only or playing conditions warrant, the time requirement will be extended by twenty (20) minutes to four hours and twenty minutes. It is the expectation of the membership that if your group cannot play in the required time or, if there is an open hole in front, that faster

groups should be asked to play through. Please inform the starter if a group declines to play through, by your invitation. Any group or individual, including those that may not complete their rounds, that keeps others from being able to complete their round in the required time will be subject to the following measures:

- 1) The Golf Committee will write each member of a group which initially violates Rule 34.1 that a fine and forfeiture of lottery draw privilege will be levied against each member of the group on the next occurrence.
- 2) For the second violation, a \$100.00 fine will be assessed, and such member will forfeit the lottery draw privilege for one month. The member will be responsible for applicable guest fines.
- 3) For the third violation, a \$250.00 fine will be assessed, and such member will forfeit the lottery draw privilege for three months. The member will be responsible for applicable guest fines.
- 4) For the fourth offense, the violator will appear before the Board of Directors.
- 5) The violations will be accumulative from October 1 through September 30 for each year.

NOTE It is recognized that priority on the golf course belongs to threesomes, foursomes and fivesomes. The starter may try and pair twosomes or singles, so that the pace of play will be smoother for all. Members are expected to cooperate reasonably with the starter's or Golf Professional's efforts to pair twosomes or singles. Courtesy should dictate the ability of smaller groups to play through, but priority on busy day still belongs to the recognized groups.

34.2 Fivesomes may be played at any time, unless otherwise determined by the Golf Professional.

Sixsomes (or more) will not be permitted at any time.

34.3 Players taking time out for lunch between nine-hole rounds lose all priority.

34.4 There will be no practicing at any time on the playing greens, tees or fairways.

34.5 Under no circumstances will a ball be played from any green or apron of a green except in playing for a hole on the green. In all other cases, the ball should be dropped off of the green and apron without penalty. Bags, portable seats or carts shall not be placed on the putting surface.

34.6 Players shall repair their ball marks on greens and place sand in fairway divots. Walkers should "kick in" their divots to repair them.

34.7 Local Rules are printed on the back of the score card.

34.8 All players will start on the number one hole, except as otherwise permitted by the Golf Professional.

34.9 The order of play will be determined by starting times arranged through the Golf Pro Shop, unless play is regulated by tournament and/or shotgun starts.

35. CADDIES

35.1 All caddies are required to register with the Golf Shop and they will be assigned as determined by the Golf Shop and/or Golf Professional in their discretion. Complaints concerning caddie performance should be directed to the Golf Professional.

36. DRIVING RANGES, GOLF LEARNING FACILITY AND PAR 3 PRACTICE AREA

As a condition of use, each user of these areas assumes all responsibility for damaged property, or injury to person, occurring as a result of his or her use; and agrees to indemnify Lakeside Country Club from any claims with respect thereto. Further, all those using these areas must sign the Range Register.

36.1 Golf Learning Facility

- a. All etiquette and attire rules consistent with standing golf rules
- b. Bays used for teaching and fitting purposes only. Members must be accompanied by a staff member to utilize equipment
- c. Hours of Operation
- d. Will follow normal golf shop hours
- e. Will follow same calendar as golf shop
- f. Individual Lesson Fees are the same for video or non-video instruction
- g. Scheduling Protocol will remain the same—call Golf Shop 281-497-2228

36.2 Par 3 / Practice Area

- a. All etiquette and attire rules consistent with the standing golf rules
- b. Hours of Operation are same as golf course
- c. Golf Course Superintendent and Golf Shop will determine usage as Par 3 or Driving Range
- d. Par 3 rules
 - a. No tee times
 - b. No more than 5 players in one group
 - c. Only one golf ball per player – no practicing on the par 3 greens
 - d. Walking only, trolleys permitted
 - e. Play holes in proper order
 - f. Players making turn will alternate with those starting play
 - g. Children under 10 must be accompanied by an adult
 - h. Guest fee (only accompanied guests) Included with normal guest fee when playing 18 hole course. A \$30 guest fee will apply if not playing regular 18 hole course

37. DRESS CODE

All members and their guests must wear appropriate and traditional golf attire at all times while on the golf course, par 3 course, driving range, practice greens and other golf practice areas, which includes wearing appropriate shirts at all times.

Inappropriate golf attire shall include (but not be limited to) the following: swimming, jogging or tennis attire; shorts which are not Bermuda-style; shorts or skirts that are not golf specific; short skirts; jeans; tee-

shirts; tank tops; halter tops; untucked shirts; shirts which do not have a collar (exception for ladies: shirts without collars which otherwise comply with this Dress Code); and any other attire which the Golf Professional shall consider to be inappropriate.

Only spikeless golf shoes, and smooth sole athletic shoes, may be worn on the golf course, driving range, practice greens, and other golf practice areas.

Each member shall be responsible for the attire of such member’s guests and family members. The Golf Professional may, at his or her discretion, make exceptions for children 14 and under.

38. MISCELLANEOUS

38.1 All tournament matches will be played under the Rules of the U.S.G.A., except as modified by Local Rules published by the Golf Committee and the Green and Grounds Committee.

38.2 A match not prepared to tee off at its reserved time forfeits its position. If, as a result of frost, rain or other adverse weather conditions, players are unable to tee off at their appointed time, those times are eliminated, and the Starter will attempt to insert groups whose tee times have been eliminated into available time openings (if any) in the order of such groups’ original tee times.

38.3 Bottles, cans or other containers must not be carried onto the Golf Course except in golf carts. Receptacles are available on each hole for disposition of such articles and shall be used.

38.4 Bath and hand towels are not to be removed from the Locker Room for use on the Golf Course or for any other purpose.

39. NURSERY SERVICE FOR CHILDREN

39.1 A children’s nursery is provided offering babysitting services for children aged six months to six years, for members and their guests only. Children are limited to two hours maximum per visit. ***Members and their guests are asked to please make reservations*** (up to 48 hours in advance is requested) or we cannot ensure availability during posted operating hours, which are as follows:

Monday – Friday	8 a.m. – 6 p.m.
Saturday	8 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.
Sunday	Closed
Holidays	Closed

39.2 Parents are required to be present, using the Tennis, Fitness or nearby Golf facilities while their children are in the nursery. For the safety and security of the children, parents will be required to check their children in and out, and to provide proper identification. Parents will be required to provide a cellular phone number in case of emergency.

SWIMMING POOL RULES

40. HOURS

40.1 The Resort Pool will be open during the hours as posted. There will be no swimming outside of these hours or at any time when a Lifeguard is not present. The Resort Pool will be closed on Mondays.

40.2 The Lap Pool will be open to all members and guests during operating hours when a lifeguard is present. The Lap Pool will be available only to adult members for lap swimming when there is no lifeguard a signed waiver must be on file at the pool office prior to lap swimming during non-operating hours.

41. GUESTS AND FEES

41.1 Guests shall be accompanied by a member at all times except those holding a guest card issued as provided in the Standing Rules. Guest fees are \$5.00 per person, and \$3.00 for each grandchild, at all times. Grandchildren and adult children of members are considered guests and must be accompanied by a member. Dropping off guests at the pool is not allowed. Guests who arrive prior to the member will be asked to wait until the member arrives after which the guest may use the pool facilities.

41.2 During the month of June on days when Youth Camp is in session, Camp children and non-member parents are allowed to remain at the pool until 5:00 p.m. without a member accompanying them. After 5:00 p.m., they are required to vacate the pool facility. An exception will be during home swim meets, when participating children and non-member parents will be allowed to stay at the pool until closing.

Violations of these Rules will result in the following measures:

- a) The Pool and Youth Committee will write a letter to the member host of the guest upon the first violation.
- b) The second violation will result in a \$50 guest fee, charged to the member's account.
- c) The third violation will automatically terminate all guest privileges for the remainder of the current Pool Season.

42. TOWELS

There is no charge for towels issued by the Club. Members may, of course, furnish their own towels. Club towels are not to be removed from the premises. Failure to leave towels on the property may result in a replacement fee.

43. SERVICE

Soft drinks, beer and cocktails will be served at the pool. Full menu service will be available, as well as fountain service, from the Oasis Café. Persons in swimming attire must dry off prior to entering the Oasis Café. Food and beverage may not be brought to the Club for consumption on the premises except where permission is obtained for special items such as birthday cakes, etc.

44. WAVE CAVE

44.1 The Wave Cave is available to minors of all ages, although certain areas or equipment may be restricted to certain ages. The attendant, through instructions from the management, will have authority to enforce all Rules of the Wave Cave.

44.2 Wave Cave Rules: No balls allowed in the Wave Cave, television stations will be changed by adults only, food and drinks must stay on the tables, no horseplay, swimmers should dry off thoroughly prior to entering the Wave Cave in an attempt to keep the floors from becoming slippery.

44.3 Everyone using the Wave Cave is responsible for helping to keep the area clean and usable for other members and guests. Children will be held accountable for broken items due to misuse.

44.4 Parents will be held responsible for the behavior of their children and their children's guests at all times. The same Rules apply to grandparents and their grandchildren.

45. SWIMMING INSTRUCTIONS

A qualified staff of Swimming Instructors is available for private lessons and stroke clinics. All Swimming Instructors and/or Swim Team coaches are Lakeside staff and certified Red Cross Water Safety Instructors

46. SPECIAL POOL RULES

46.1 Children under the age of 10 years should not be left unattended for any period of time.

46.2 During posted operating hours, in order to use either the Resort or Lap Pool unaccompanied by parents, minor children of members must demonstrate their swimming ability to a Lifeguard. His or her qualification will involve a swimming test. In no event shall a child who cannot qualify be permitted in the pool or on the adjacent pool deck unless a parent is with the child. The parent is responsible for adherence to this Standing Rule.

46.3 Lifeguards are not responsible for children in the Wading Pool area.

46.4 Dangerous play in or around the pools such as running around the pool deck, pushing, dunking, diving in shallow water, etc. is prohibited. Any accident or injury, no matter how minor, should be reported to the Lifeguard.

46.5 Children wearing a flotation device will not be permitted in the diving board area or the slide area unless accompanied by their parent.

46.6 No swimmers are allowed in the deep water while others are diving. Only one diver on the board at a time.

46.7 Only objects designed for pool use are allowed in the pool.

46.8 Eating and drinking are prohibited in all pools.

46.9 No one who is ill, recently injured, or has a skin disease or other infection may enter any pool.

46.10 Lifeguards and pool staff will have the authority to require compliance with these Rules and to insure the safety and comfort of Club members and guests.

47. SPECIAL POOL AREA RULES

47.1 Members and guests must register at the entrance to the pool facility.

47.2 Automobiles will be parked only in places provided for parking.

47.3 No property of Lakeside Country Club, to include Club towels, will be removed from the grounds. Removal of club property is subject to a replacement fee for said item.

47.4 Only Styrofoam or plastic glasses may be used at the pool facility and surrounding area. No bottles or other glass containers are allowed.

48. DRESS CODE

48.1 Lakeside is a family club, and members and their guests are encouraged to wear appropriate and conservative swimsuits when using the pools. Street clothing, such as shorts and cut-offs, is not permitted in any pool.

48.2 All persons in swimming attire will remain in the pool area.

48.3 Persons in swimming attire, or without shirts or shoes, are not allowed near the lakes.

48.4 When in the Oasis Café or the outside upper deck, wet swimsuits are not permitted. A cover-up or tee shirt shall be worn over dry swimsuits. No bare feet are allowed; flip-flops are acceptable.

49. POOL PARTIES

49.1 Non-Member and Sponsored Pool Parties, such as graduation parties, class parties, etc. can only be hosted prior to Memorial Day or after Labor Day on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday.

a. The party will have access to the Resort Pool, pavilion and Wave Cave. The Lap Pool will remain open for swim team practice.

- 1) c. A minimum of (6) life guards are required at the Club stated rate.
- 2) d. A food and beverage minimum applies.
- 3) e. LCC sanctioned events are not subject to these guidelines.

49.2 Personal Member Pool Parties, such as a birthday party for a child or grandchild of a member may be hosted under the following guidelines and cannot exceed thirty (30) children.

- a. A member may host a party Friday through Sunday in the month of May before Memorial Day.
- b. A member may host a party after Memorial Day to Labor Day excluding Mondays and holidays.
- c. No more than one party can be scheduled or be in progress at any one time.
- d. The resort pool and lap pool will remain open to members and their guests.

49.3 Cancelation of Non-Member, Sponsored and Personal Member Pool Parties

- a. A party may be canceled (24) hours in advance due to weather conditions with no financial responsibility to the Club. Written notice must be provided to the Catering Office.
- b. A party may be canceled (48) hours in advance due to a non-weather related reason. Written notice must be provided to the Catering Office.
- c. The Club reserves the right to cancel a party (24) hours in advance if they deem conditions are unsafe.

49.4 Lawn parties not utilizing the pool do not fall into this category. Any party utilizing the pool area during non-operating hours must have a lifeguard on duty, even if

members and guests are not swimming. Adult parties utilizing the pools can be booked during normal pool hours when under the 30-person limit.

LAKE AND GROUNDS RULES

50. USE OF WATERCRAFT

No boats, canoes, rafts or other watercraft are permitted on the lakes except for supervised instruction under the Youth Program.

51. HUNTING

No hunting or shooting is permitted anywhere on the property. Lakes may be used for fishing only as designated in Section 55 below.

52. SWIMMING

There will be no wading or swimming in the lakes under any circumstances. Parents should be cautioned that the lakes are deep in places and small children are not permitted to go unattended near the lakes or on the bridges. Parents are responsible for maintaining compliance with this rule.

53. DRESS CODE

Swimming attire and bare feet are not allowed when in vicinity of any of the lakes. A shirt and shoes should be worn.

54. DUMPING

No refuse of any kind shall be thrown into the lakes or on its banks.

55. FISHING

55.1 Fishing is permitted from dawn until dusk.

55.2 All types of fishing tackle are permitted.

55.3 All fish caught must be released.

55.4 Members, their spouses, and guests are personally responsible for compliance with all applicable fishing laws.

55.5 There is to be no fishing from the bridges.

55.6 Monday – All lakes on the Club grounds may be fished from dawn until dusk, unless there is a scheduled golf tournament or the Club is open. Must sign in with Security prior to fishing.

55.8 **7 Tuesday through Sunday** – Only the large oxbow lake behind the Clubhouse may be fished anytime from dawn until dusk, except on those portions intersected by the 9th, 10th and 18th holes.

55.8 Guests are not allowed to fish except in the company of a member, or member's spouse. No more than two guests per membership.

55.9 Children of members under the age of 10 may fish only when accompanied by an adult.

56. BICYCLES

All bicycles, motorcycles, handicap scooters and similar vehicles may enter the Club premises only at the main entrance and then proceed immediately to the special parking area provided for such vehicles at each major facility. This rule applies to all members, their household families and all principal guests.

57. SKATEBOARDS / ROLLERBLADES / RECREATIONAL SCOOTERS

Skateboards, rollerblades and recreational scooters are not allowed at any time on Club property.

58. ISLAND AND BRIDGES

58.1 Since the principal purpose of the Island refreshment area is to serve the golfers, they shall have priority of service. Thereafter, others may be served.

This area is not considered a part of the Pool and, therefore, no one in bathing attire is permitted.

58.2 Children may use the walkway on bridges crossing lakes nearest Clubhouse except after dark. The bridge crossing lake between Island and No. 10 green is "off limits" to children at all times.

58.3 Children under ten (10) years of age must be attended by an adult when in the vicinity of the bridges and lakes.

59. CHALLENGE COURSE

59.1 The use of the challenge course is limited to Lakeside events and private events which are booked through the Club and run by qualified Lakeside staff. All participants must: be a minimum of 6 years old, weigh between 35-275 pounds, have on athletic shoes and have a release of liability and indemnity agreement on file in the pool office prior to participation.

TENNIS RULES

59. USE

The use of the tennis courts at Lakeside Country Club is restricted to members of Lakeside Country Club and their guests, and for use by the Club Professional for giving lessons to members and to guests of members when the guest is sponsored by a member, but guest lessons are to be given only when members are not available for lessons.

60. "MEMBERS" DEFINED

The term "Member" of Lakeside Country Club as used herein shall be defined as in Rule 1.

61. PLAYER REGISTRATION AND RESERVATION OF COURTS

61.1 All members shall enter the tennis facility through the Fitness/Tennis Center or Pro Shop, shall register to receive court assignments, and shall list the names of guest, if any, and sign guest tickets before commencing play.

61.2 Court reservations may be made no earlier than three (3) days (72 hours) in advance.

61.3 A reservation shall not exceed a two (2) hour time limit and when the adult or family of the adult finish playing at the end of the one and one-half hour time limit, the adult or family of the adult cannot continue to play under the continuous reservation unless the Professional designates another court that does not have a reservation.

61.4 No member shall have more than three (3) guests at any one time except by permission of Professional. If it becomes necessary to cancel a reservation, this must be done at the earliest possible time. Reservations will be held open ten minutes after their scheduled beginning after which the court will be made available to any member waiting to play.

61.5 Any courts so designated are exempt from normal court procedures and are reserved for play or teaching by the tennis professionals.

61.6 Courts reserved for League Play are exempt from normal court procedures.

62. GUESTS AND FEES

62.1 A "Guest" shall be any non-member player, who must be in the company of a member while on a court, except by special approval of the Fitness and Tennis Committee, or as otherwise provided in these Rules.

62.2 The adult Guest Fee (until further notice) shall be \$5.00 per person at all times.

Guest fees for children, 18 and under, playing with the children of adult members will be \$2.00 at all times. A fee of \$5.00 per person shall be levied for the use of the tennis facility where special arrangements are required. This fee shall be in addition to the tennis guest fee and the fee for extra personnel utilized.

62.3 Members of Lakeside Country Club, persons taking tennis lessons from the Tennis Professional and players in tournaments and exhibition matches conducted by the Club shall not be required to pay Guest Fees. However, play following lessons will be subject to the normal Guest Fees.

63. LOCKER ROOMS

63.1 The locker rooms are primarily for the use of adults, and children are not allowed except for access to the rest rooms, or while accompanied by an adult.

63.2 Lockers are provided for daily use only at no charge for the convenience of members and their guests. Personal belongings are to be removed at the end of each visit to the Tennis and Fitness facility. Lockers will be checked at closing by the Tennis and Fitness center staff, and personal items left behind will be removed and stored for 24 hours in Lost & Found. The club is not responsible for lost or stolen personal belongings or valuables.

63.3 After the Fitness & Tennis building is closed, the locker rooms may be accessed via the side door until 11:00 p.m. when the courts close.

64. DRESS CODE AND CONDUCT

64.1 All players shall wear non-marking, made-for-tennis shoes.

64.2 All players shall be adequately dressed in tasteful tennis attire. T-shirts must have sleeves and be full length. Please, no jogging shorts, swim suits, or gym wear.

64.3 Customary standards of tennis etiquette and behavior will be observed by all members and guests.

64.4 Entrance to respective courts shall be made through the gate nearest the court to be used.

65. CELLULAR PHONES

The use of cellular phones is limited to the locker rooms and outside areas of the Tennis and Fitness center. Cellular phones may be used as a music source while exercising with earbuds or headphones where appropriate.

66. GENERAL RULES

66.1 All children signing charge tickets shall sign the name of the member authorizing the use of the tennis courts and their name.

66.2 The Tennis and Fitness Committee may reserve courts for tournaments and exhibition match play and in other cases where, in its judgment, circumstances justify such reservations.

66.4 No parking shall be allowed in the circle driveway in front of the Tennis and Fitness Center.

67. NURSERY SERVICE FOR CHILDREN

67.1 A children’s nursery is provided offering babysitting services for children aged six months to six years, for members and their guests only. Children are limited to three hours maximum per visit. Members and their guests are encouraged to make reservations up to 48 hours in advance during posted operating hours, which are as follows:

Monday – Friday	8 a.m. – 12 noon, and 4 p.m. – 6 p.m.
Saturday	8:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.
Sunday	Closed
Holidays	Closed

67.2 Parents are required to be present, using the Tennis, Fitness or Golf facilities, while their children are in the nursery. For the safety and security of the children, parents will be required to check their children in and out, and to provide proper identification. Parents will be required to provide a cellular phone number in case of emergency.

67.3 Nursery fees will be posted from time to time. Until further notice, nursery fees will be \$6 per hour, per child, and will be charged to the members’ account following each visit.

Late cancellation, no show and late pick-up fees will be charged as follows:

Late Cancellation (less than three hours in advance)	\$6 per child
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No Show Fee	\$6 per child
Late Pick-Up (beyond three hour limit)	\$10 per child

68. FAMILY TENNIS ASSOCIATION - L.F.T.A.

68.1 The Lakeside Family Tennis Association was formed in 1993 for the purpose of 1) providing information to tennis-playing members and their families, 2) encouraging participation in Lakeside tennis activities and events, and 3) providing financial support to Lakeside tennis events, to include the Annual Member/Guest Tournament.

68.2 The Annual Dues are \$75 for the year October 1 through September 30.

68.3 LFTA membership has the following benefits and privileges:

- 1) No Guest Fees for the member and member's family
- 2) Reduced Entry Fees to tennis events during the year.
- 3) Promotion of Men's Women's, and Junior Tennis Programs.

FITNESS RULES

69. USE

69.1 The use of the Fitness Center at Lakeside Country Club is restricted to members of Lakeside Country Club and their guests, and for use by the fitness director, personal trainers, pilates instructors, massage therapists, group exercise instructors, and fitness attendants for giving lessons and conducting classes for members and to guests of members when the guest is sponsored by a member.

69.2 Professional services offered, class schedules, and fees will be posted at the Fitness center.

70. REGISTRATION

All members and guests must sign in at the Fitness and Tennis Center front desk upon every visit.

71. "MEMBERS" DEFINED

The term "Member" of Lakeside Country Club as used herein shall be defined as in Rule 1.

72. GUESTS AND FEES

72.1 A "Guest" shall be any non-member, and must be in the company of a member, except by special approval of the Fitness and Tennis Committee, or as otherwise provided in these Rules.

72.2 All guests must check in at the Fitness and Tennis center front desk and sign a liability waiver upon every visit.

72.3 Guest fees will be posted from time to time. Until further notice, guest fees will be \$25 per guest.

72.4 Guest Fees as specified in these Rules, as well as fees for personal training and services, group classes, etc., shall be charged to the host member and not billed through the club of a guest.

72.5 Guest Fees will be waived for out of town family members, but the guest must be accompanied by the member. Lakeside Family Guests are defined as: parents, non-household children and their spouses; brothers, sisters and their spouses; and grandchildren over the age of 15.

72.6 Local guests will be limited to no more than twelve 12 visits per year.

72.7 Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests at all times while on club premises.

72.8 No guests aged 12 to 14 will be permitted to use the Fitness facility.

73. HOURS OF OPERATION

The Fitness building will be open during the hours as posted, Monday through Sunday, to include holidays, except Christmas Day and New Year’s Day. Until further notice, the hours will be as follows

Monday – Thursday	5 a.m. – 9 p.m.
Friday	5 a.m. – 7 p.m.
Saturday	7 a.m. – 6 p.m.
Sunday	8 a.m. – 7 p.m.
Holidays	8 a.m. – 7 p.m. <i>(except those holidays when the Club closes earlier)</i>

74. LOCKER ROOMS

74.1 The locker rooms are primarily for the use of adults, and children are not allowed except for access to the rest rooms, or while accompanied by an adult.

74.2 Lockers are provided for daily use only at no charge for the convenience of members and their guests. Personal belongings are to be removed at the end of each visit to the fitness facility. Lockers will be checked at closing by the Fitness and Tennis center staff, and personal items left behind will be removed and stored for 24 hours in Lost & Found. The club is not responsible for lost or stolen personal belongings or valuables.

74.3 The Fitness and Tennis center staff will permit use of the locker rooms for up to thirty (30) minutes after closing time. However, members and their guests will be expected to vacate the building within the 30 minute extension. After closing, the lockers rooms may be accessed via the side door until 11:00 p.m. when the tennis courts close.

75. DRESS CODE AND CONDUCT

75.1 Proper and clean workout attire acceptable for a family environment is required. Athletic shoes must be worn at all times except in group exercise studios as permitted by various classes such as yoga, mat Pilates, etc.

Each member shall be responsible for the attire of such member’s guests and family members.

75.2 Customary standards of exercise etiquette and behavior will be observed by all members and guests.

75.3 Exercise equipment should be wiped off after each use. Free weight equipment should be returned to their proper racks.

75.4 Refrain from loud conversations while inside the Fitness and Tennis center, group exercise classes or locker rooms.

75.5 The use of cameras of any kind, to include the photo feature on cellular phones, is prohibited at all times inside the Fitness and Tennis center.

76. TOWELS

There is no charge for towels issued by the Club, and are not to be removed from the premises. Failure to leave towels on the property may result in a replacement fee.

77. CELLULAR PHONES

The use of cellular phones is limited to the locker rooms and outside areas of the Fitness and Tennis center. Except that they may be used as a music source while exercising with earbuds or headphones where appropriate.

78. FOOD AND DRINK SERVICE

Soft drinks, Gatorade, coffee, tea, smoothies, beer and house wine are available. Healthful snacks are also available. Consumption of any food or drink is not allowed in exercise areas or rooms, with the exception of bottled water. Water only is allowed in the locker rooms.

79. CHILDREN

79.1 Members' dependent children aged 15 years and over are permitted to use the Fitness equipment, programs and services as adults, provided they conduct themselves accordingly.

79.2 Members' dependent children aged 12 to 14 years may use the Fitness equipment, programs and services provided they have completed a Youth Certification Program, and are accompanied and supervised by an adult member. No guests aged 12 to 14 will be permitted to use the fitness facilities.

79.3 Members' dependent children aged 7 to 11 years will be permitted to use the Fitness and Tennis facility rest rooms, but may not loiter in the Locker Rooms and are not permitted use of Fitness equipment, programs or services. The Fitness center will offer a limited number of special fitness classes and programs for children aged 7 to 11 years.

80. NURSERY SERVICE FOR CHILDREN

80.1 A children's nursery is provided offering babysitting services for children aged six months to six years, for members and their guests only. Children are limited to three hours maximum per visit. Members and their guests are encouraged to make reservations up to 48 hours in advance during posted operating hours, which are as follows:

Monday – Friday	8 a.m. – 12 noon, and 4 p.m. – 6 p.m.

80.2 Parents are required to be present, using the Tennis, Fitness or Golf facilities, while their children are in the nursery. For the safety and security of the children, parents will be required to check their children in and out, and to provide proper identification. Parents will be required to provide a cellular phone number in case of emergency.

80.3 Nursery fees will be posted from time to time. Until further notice, babysitting fees will be \$6 per hour, per child, and will be charged to the members’ account following each visit.

Late cancellation, no show and late pick-up fees will be charged as follows:

Late Cancellation (less than three hours in advance)	\$6 per child
No Show Fee	\$6 per child
Late Pick-Up (beyond three hour limit)	\$10 per child

GENERAL

81. Enforcement of the Standing Rules shall be by Management on behalf of the Board of Directors.

82. WEAPONS

82.1 Weapons of any kind are not permitted inside the club facilities. This includes those with or without a license to carry.

83. VOTING

The content of completed ballots and completed proxies for voting on assessments or additional equity contributions pursuant to Article VII of the By-Laws or for the election of directors pursuant to Section 12.5 of the By-Laws shall be kept confidential except as required for verification, authentication and tabulation of the ballots or proxies. This rule shall not preclude demographic or statistical analysis of the voting on matters other than the election of Directors, provided that the confidentiality of individual proxies and ballots is maintained.
